

# Hókwextset te toltí:lqel qes thá:yttset kw'e sqwéltel We are using the dictionary and building sentences

Let's build (and translate) basic sentences to more complex sentences by finding words and phrases in the dictionary. Let's start with a 'template' and fill it in with words you are choosing from the dictionary.

Important note: Do not translate directly from xwelitemael to Halq'eméylem. Find sample sentences in the dictionary (even if they have different words) to get a sense for the pattern that is correct. Ask an elder/experienced teacher.

### 1. The 'basic' sentence

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> (note that this is a rough guideline for 'basic' sentences. Especially in fluent speech and storytelling, you might find different patterns. Consider a simple comparison in English:

<sup>&</sup>quot;Big bear jumped on the frog" vs "on the frog jumped Big bear". Which one is the 'more neutral' sentence?)



## 2. Adding more elements

verb or adjective + pronoun ending that matches the 'participants' (who is doing what to whom?) I jump. I see you. He sees me. We look at them. He eats an apple... etc)

<u>note</u>: when the verb or adjective is just having the action done 'by itself or onto itself', the noun is the subject. If the verb or adjective has a marker (like -t, -et, etc) that indicates it is done onto others or another thing (linguists call this 'transitive')



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## 3. Adding even more elements

verb or adjective + pronoun ending that matches the 'participants' (who is doing what to whom?) Add descriptive words (adjectives) or other 'participants'.

# 4. combining sentences with conjunctions: 'that' or 'because'

you can extend a sentence by saying 'that' or 'because': I am tired because.... he is happy that.... that: kw's because: tl'o kw's (see BG 832)

that/ because I kw'els ... tl'o kw'els (or also tl'ekwels)

that/ because you kw'ás ... tl'o kw'as that/ because he/she/it/they kw'ses ... tl'o kw'ses that/ because we kw's tset ... tl'o kw's tset that/ because you folks kw's elep ... tl'o kw's elep
